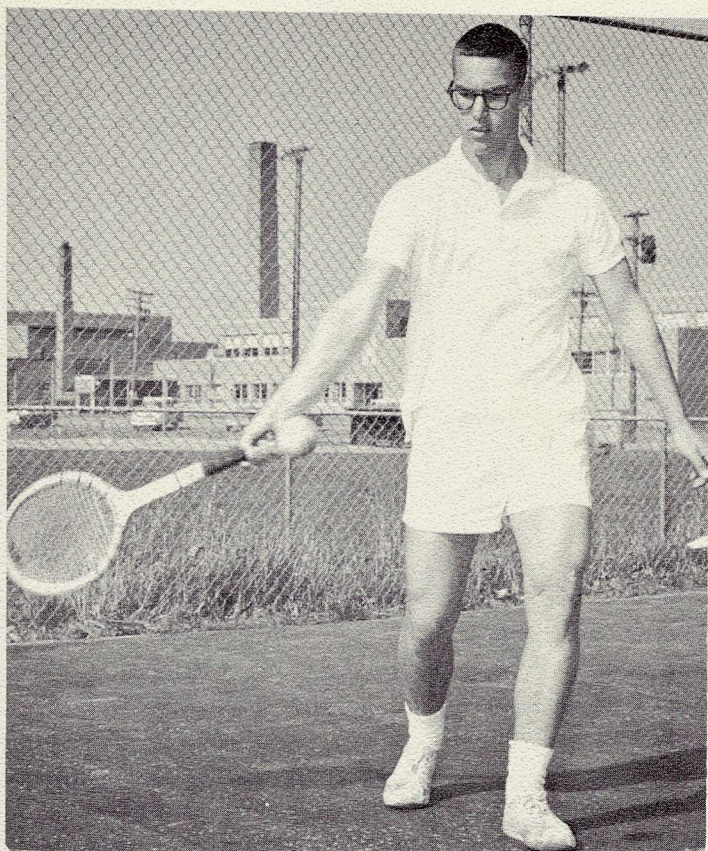


# Tennis team wins eight, drops two



Ed Haubert makes a good return by watching the ball and his forehand form during a match on Southfield's courts.

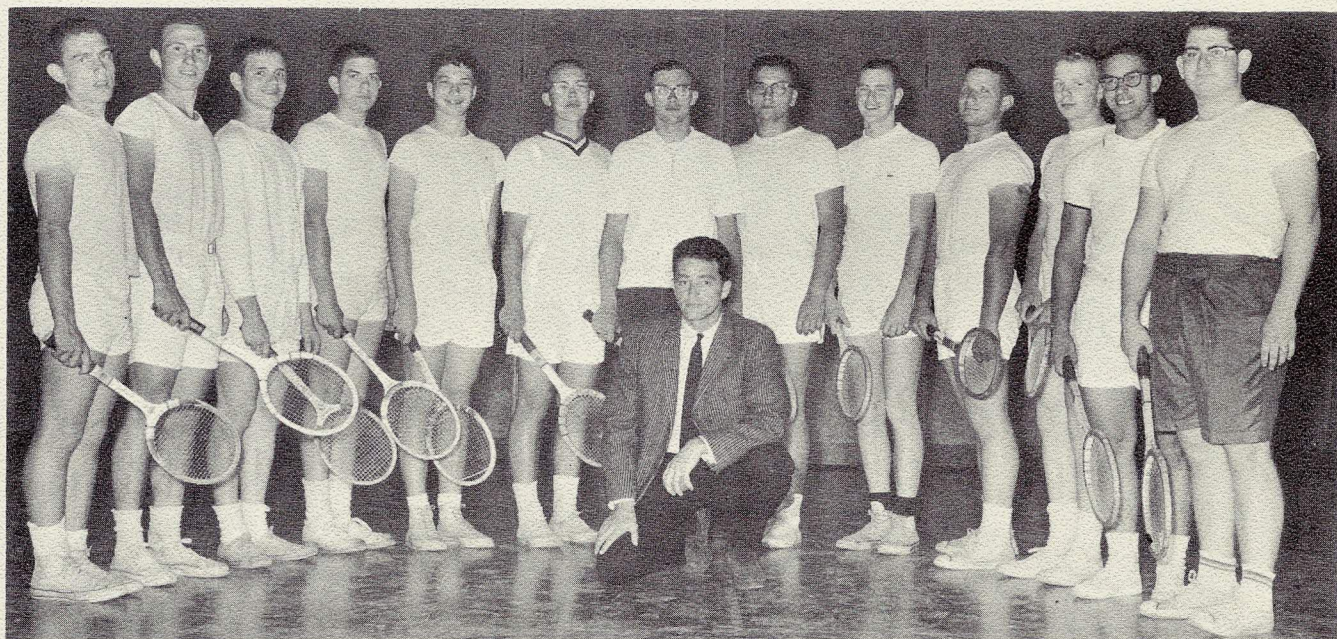
